PRUNING



On the first dry, sunny and relatively windless day this month, I spent a few hours in the Edible Forest pruning dormant honeyberry and currant bushes and cutting back branches of some trees. Back at the house the goats enjoyed munching on the pruning's tender stems and buds.

PLANTING



Mud season is upon us! Hopefully the sun will shine, the air will warm, and the ground will dry a bit in the next week or two so cold-tolerant sets of onions, kale and chard, grown in the house under lights, can be planted in the vegetable garden, and Dave's tractor won't get stuck in the mud delivering hay to the cows. The grass does not green up and grow enough until about mid-May to start moving the animals around on the pasture.
