WHAT IS A COVER CROP



A cover crop is a non-food-producing planting that keeps roots in the ground in a fallow area. Here common oats, planted the first week in September, form a lush groundcover to feed the soil life and intercept pest cycles. The oats will be winter-killed before they set seed, leaving a hay-like mulch which can be planted into with no-till food crops in the spring.

WHERE DOES THE HAY COME FROM


